Greetings,

While most locals don't begin to think about a nominating committee until February or so, MCCPTA's Nominating Committee has already begun the work to find officers for the 08-09 year. The Nominating Committee is also responsible for making sure clusters and areas nominate cluster coordinators and area-vice presidents in an open process. It is not too early for each cluster to start thinking about who will serve as cluster coordinator next year. Please read through the materials from the MCCPTA Nominating Committee in this letter to familiarize yourself with the process.

Our treasurer recently sent out invoices for the annual bonding and liability insurance. More information on this and dues payments are in the treasurer's report. We will receive our first membership report from Maryland PTA towards the end of January. After we receive that, we will forward information to cluster coordinators so they can work with their locals who still need to send in dues.

Reflections entries are due on January 2 to the MCCPTA office. Our office manager has posted the hours when she will be in the MCCPTA office to receive the entries. Please make sure that all entries are labeled in legible printing.

Today the BOE Policy Committee heard a brief update on the grading and reporting policy. They heard that MCPS will be conducting focus groups to introduce the new third grade report

card starting in third quarter. Please watch for notices of these opportunities to provide feedback on the draft report card and make sure to forward the information to your members.

MCCPTA will host an operating budget forum on Monday, January 7, 2008, at 7:30pm. This is considered a special delegate assembly and we hope that delegates and presidents will also invite their membership to attend this forum. Members of the BOE, the County Council, County Executive's staff, and MCPS staff have been invited to attend to answer your questions about the MCPS recommended budget and the fiscal situation. Testimony on the operating budget to the BOE takes place on two Wednesdays, January 9th and 16th.

Our Operating Budget Committee will host a testimony-writing workshop on Saturday, January 5th, 9-11am, at Einstein HS. Although this workshop is mostly geared toward cluster coordinators who will be in the process of preparing their cluster's testimony, it is open to all interested members, especially anyone who will be giving budget testimony. The Operating Budget Committee will present additional details and answer questions about the budget and we will work to develop budget themes.

All PTA presidents should receive a copy of the Superintendent's Recommended FY 2009 Operating Budget at their school. MCCPTA Board of Directors members who provided a pony address can also pick them up at the schools; if you did not provide a pony address, you can pick

up a copy of the operating budget in Room 247 of the BOE building.

I recently sent a letter to all principals at special education schools and centers offering our assistance if parents at those schools want to form a PTA. We have also suggested that the parents at those centers may want to form one joint PTA. Since enrollments at those schools are lower than at other schools, it may be difficult to sustain the administrative and financial burden of a PTA with small groups of parents. We are also taking steps to make sure the appropriate cluster coordinators include these schools in their CIP advocacy.

We are preparing a mailing to potential sponsors of the Presidents/Principals Dinner. If you know of any corporations, foundations, or people who might be inclined to support MCCPTA, please let Committee Chair April Keyes know so she can contact them.

MCCPTA-EPI has just announced the return of Hands on Science. They will be running a small pilot program this spring, if you are interested in a HOS program at your school this spring, please see the information in this letter.

All officers receive phone calls and emails from local PTA officers and members seeking guidance and advice. From these calls and messages we get to know many fine people who are working hard to support students and to provide a voice to parents in their school. Many of these people would benefit from attending training sessions and reading our guidebooks although we know that we don't cover all possible issues in these books. The guidebooks are available on our website under PTA Resources. If you have not read the appropriate guidebooks, please take a half hour over break and do so. Unfortunately these phone

calls and emails sometimes reveal PTA members who have trouble conducting themselves professionally and don't seem to be furthering the mission of the PTA. I would ask that all PTA leaders and members treat each other with respect and don't say or write anything that they would not want the students in their school to read. PTA leaders must always make their local bylaws available to any member who asks. It is the secretary's responsibility to have the bylaws at each PTA meeting in case members need to refer to them.

We have arranged training for MCCPTA Board of Directors members on March 1st from 10am to 2pm. All BOD members should expect to attend this training; more information will be forthcoming. We will be discussing the role of BOD members and also covering a lot of material that will help you provide support to your local PTAs. The MCCPTA Training Committee is also in the process of setting up some mini training for local PTA officers around the county. Please watch for dates for these trainings. When locals do turn their attention to nominating next year's officers, one criterion should be the candidate's willingness to learn how to do the job.

Many of our MCCPTA committees need additional members to help carry out their mission. Please distribute the attached flyer advertising these committees to your members—either on your list serve, in your newsletter, or via backpack.

I am looking forward to a few days off over break to recharge. Wishing you a relaxing break and a Happy New Year.

Grading and Reporting Committee

Final Exam Workgroup Recommendation re: AP/IB/CIE Student Exemptions from MCPS Final Exam - After receiving the MCCPTA's formal opposition to the workgroup's earlier recommendation, MCPS reconvened the Final Exam Workgroup on November 19, 2007. Workgroup members discussed parent, student, staff and teacher feedback at length and, in the end, renewed the previously recommended option and added language (*in italics below*). The language below is the revised recommendation recently sent to Dr. Frieda Lacey.

All students enrolled in AP/IB/CIE courses during semester B are exempt from the traditional two-hour final examination *administered during final exam week*, but will complete an end-of-course, culminating activity/assessment that counts as 25 percent of the semester grade (same as final examination). *The culminating activity/assessment will be developed by school-based subject area teams and based on centrally developed guidelines.*

On November 5, 2007, the Grading and Reporting Committee enjoyed a presentation by Hollis Krotchko, Office of the Chief Technology Officer, and Betsy Brown, Director of the Office of Curriculum and Instructional Programs, regarding MCPS' current marking period calculation methods used (raw score conversion and summation conversion to percent) and Special Grades used in the Online Achievement and Reporting System (OARS). The meanings and accepted uses of special grades X, Z and 0 were explained in detail to G/R committee members. The materials from the OARS and Special Grades presentations are located under the files section of the MCCPTAGradingAndReporting Yahoo group.

Text issues will be shared with the Committee when they become ripe for discussion (this is determined by the One Text Committee). Enjoy the rest of 2007 and a safe holiday season with your families.

Please plan to join us for another MCPS presentation on the new standards-based third grade report card at the January 7, 2008 meeting, Carver Conference Room 120.

Health Committee

There was a citizen’s advisory committee meeting held on Wednesday, Nov. 28th. I was unable to attend the meeting but here are some highlights of the recent 8th grade sex-ed classes reported by Betsy Brown, MCPS: The new 8th grade sex-ed classes have been held in 35 of Montgomery County’s 38 middle schools. Of the 2,263 students who were eligible for the classes, 2,146 or 95 per cent got parental opt-in and took the classes. 117 students took the alternate units; of those, some parents refused to sign and some kids lost their permission slips – unable to tell specifics. (Last spring’s pilot test had 88 percent opt-in.) At parent information meetings, it appears that when more parents showed up at meetings, the opt-in rate at that school was higher. There was a lot of variation among schools re: parent participation.

MRSA: The Nov. 27th Delegates Assembly information session was devoted to MRSA and Transportation Safety. The MRSA session included presentations from Judy Covich, Head of School Health Services, Mont. County Dept. of Health and Human Services, and Pam Montgomery, Safety Officer, MCPS. They provided information about the MCPS response to MRSA and ongoing efforts to identify cases and take precautionary measure to prevent the spread of MRSA. The pediatrician, Dr. DeBiasi, from Children’s Hospital arrived late (traffic) but gave a very concise and clear overview of MRSA. All speakers answered questions from parents. New information has been added to the MCCPTA web site – the main page and under Health Committee, based on some of the materials presented at the DA, specifically; links to some of the photographs of staph infection were added. They are graphic so a cautionary note precedes the links. I have sent this information out to parents via the list serve.

Vending Contracts: There was an article in a recent Gazette regarding vending contracts and the funds that are no longer available to schools. MCPS has consolidated all vending contracts and will be providing funds back to schools based on the items that are consumed. While principals and parents from some schools are concerned about the lack of vending funds, there are a number of ways to raise funds that do not promote vending choices – healthy or unhealthy. There are a number of resources and links available on the MCCPTA web site – under Health Committee, that parents are urged to look at for ideas on healthy fundraising and information on vending contracts. I have sent this information out to parents via the list serve.

MCCPTA Health Committee Web Site: I have updated the Health Committee information, reorganized, and added additional topics and links (actually, I made suggested revisions and Lin-Lin did all of the work!!).

Physical Education: I was asked, along with Susan Loftus, PE Teacher at Burning Tree ES, to meet with Councilman Berliner regarding the status of PE in MCPS schools. He is concerned about the limited opportunities students have – especially at the ES level – to be physically active. He and his staff are looking at different options to urge MCPS to increase PE minutes. This was an informational meeting to discuss the current state of PE. I’ll keep you posted on follow up actions.

delegates, which was passed by the Delegates with a minor amendment regarding the expansion of EFO services to elementary and middle schools. Pam Moomau also presented the Operating Budget Compact to the Assembly, which was likewise passed by the Delegates with several amendments, including amendments regarding hours-based special education services, extension of on-line achievement reporting in secondary schools, and recess supervision by MCPS staff.

The 2008 Operating Budget Workshop will be held at Einstein High School, 11135 Newport Mill Road, Kensington, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 5, 2008. The 2008 Operating Budget Forum with elected County and Board of Education officials will be held on Monday, January 7, 2008, from 7:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at Carver Educational Center. Please put these dates on your calendars.
